# Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. In Matthew 28:9, Jesus first word to the women was almost casual. It was a familiar greeting: "Hello" or "Rejoice."
- 2. Why is death not the final word for the believer? Consider: "Christianity is not reconciliation with death ... Christ is the revelation of life. And only if Christ is life, is death what Christianity proclaims it to be, namely the enemy to be destroyed, and not a 'mystery' to be explained."—Fr. Schmemann
- 3. When you consider the two fires that Peter stood by at the end of the gospel of John (Peter's denial and Peter's reinstatement), what hope does the resurrection give those of us who need second, third, and fourth chances?
- 4. Jesus makes us take his resurrection on his own terms. How does this foster grace in our hearts? In what way do some foster rebellion instead?
- 5. "O God, who by your One and only Son has overcome death and opened to us the gate of everlasting life; grant, we pray, that those who have been redeemed by his passion may rejoice in his resurrection, through the same Christ our Lord." 5th century prayer

# SERMON TEXT Luke 24:1-12, 33-40 (ESV)

<sup>1</sup> But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. <sup>2</sup> And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, <sup>3</sup> but when they went in they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. <sup>4</sup> While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling apparel. <sup>5</sup> And as they were frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? <sup>6</sup> He is not here, but has risen.
