Presuppositions: Your beliefs of assumptions about the world and reality that you have. It is like your basic operating system on your computer. Turn it on, and what is already loaded in memory runs the system (Windows 8 or OS X Yosemite). If you presuppose that God does not exist, then you will look at life with that assumption. If you presuppose that miracles cannot happen, then anything that looks like a miracle can't be one by your definition. These are beliefs that are held without evidence or proofs; your starting point. Everyone has presuppositions.


MetaPhysics: In philosophy, this refers to the study of first principles of things; abstract concepts such as being, knowing, time, and space. A general view of the world,
