COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: *1 John 2:9-11*

Anyone who claims to be in the light but hates a brother or sister is still in the darkness. Anyone who loves their brother and sister lives in the light, and there is nothing in them to make them stumble. But anyone who hates a brother or sister is in the darkness and walks around in the darkness. They do not know where they are going, because the darkness has blinded them.

All: O Lord Almighty, you have called us out of darkness and have chosen us to be your people. We should be filled with gratitude for your mercy; we should be filled with courage to war against our flesh. Yet we consider ourselves worthy of your mercy, and barely lift a hand to fight against our lusts. Our conduct often gives no indication that we belong to you. Forgive us for abusing your grace by not resisting temptation. Forgive us for abasing your glory by not being a light to the world. Please fill us with boldness and righteousness in our words and in our deeds, so that the appearing of Christ Jesus our Lord would be evident in our lives, to his praise. Amen

DECLARATION OF GRACE: *John 1:9, 12*

The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world ... to all who have receive him, to those who believe in his name, he gave the right to become children of God.

Sermon Questions for Further Reflection

1. The Magi are typically advisors to a king. Likely they are from Babylon. They would have been astrologers and diviners. What are we to make of God bringing them to the birth of his son?
2. The Scribes quote from Micah 5:2 to tell Herod where the Messiah was to be born. How does Micah 5:4 tell us who the Messiah is going to be? (see also 2 Sam 5:2)
3. In what way can people miss the point about the star in the East? Read Balaam's oracle in Num 24:17. How are these Magi an anti-type of Balaam? Read 2 Pet 2:19. What is the theological significance of the start of that passage?
4. The beginning of Matthew's gospel is "come and see" and the end is "go and tell." Who does this also show a shift in the role of God's people from OT to NT? How is this also the pattern of discipleship?
5. Consider: "Missions exist because worship does not. In light of God's redemptive plan for humanity, mission is just a temporary necessity, but worship is forever. Worship then is the fuel for missions."—John Piper
6. The book ends of Matthew are about the Messiah and the Gentiles. How does this fit into Matthew's very "Jewish" gospel?

God Cleanses Us

The biblical response to God's call to be in his presence is confessing our sins. We humble ourselves when we approach our God. This is a corporate prayer of all God's people. It is a great privilege of the gospel that we can stand forgiven before the Lord of glory.

The Light of Christ is the Dawning of Missions

Matthew 2:1-12 (ESV)

¹Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, ²saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." ³When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. ⁵They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet:

⁶"And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel."

⁷Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. ⁸And he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship him." ⁹After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. ¹¹And going into the house they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. ¹²And being warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed to their own country by another way.
