COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: 1 Peter 1:14-16

As obedient children, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance, but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, since it is written, 'You shall be holy, for I am holy.'

Leader: For you are not a God who delights in wickedness; evil may not dwell with you.

All: Father cleanse us, for our secret thoughts savor our lusts and our wicked desires.

Leader: The boastful shall not stand before your eyes; you hate all evildoers.

All: Almighty God forgive us, for in our pride we despise humility and submission to others, and do not consider others before ourselves.

Leader: You destroy those who speak lies; the LORD abhors the blood-thirsty and deceitful man.

All: Father we confess that our hearts are filled with deceit, and that we often treat the truth with indifference.

Sermon Questions For Further Reflection

1. Throughout the gospels, we see the phrase: This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet. What is the significance of this?
2. How does v-14 connect with 2 Sam. 5:6-7?
3. The people thought they understood who and what the Messiah was to be; yet Jesus did things that defied their understanding of Messiah and offended them. What were some of those differences? Why is this important to keep in mind when we attempt to move our eyes off of ourselves and onto Jesus?
4. Letting go of our expectations for what we think our lives should be, or how our family should have turned out is a death of sorts. In many ways, following Jesus produces a series of mini-deaths in our lives. Discuss.
5. Disappointments are hard to take by anyone; yet the Lord calls us to trust him in the midst of them – to walk by faith and not by sight. What has helped you with this in your own life? In what ways do you still struggle?
6. What is the significance of Zech. 9:11 “because of the blood of my covenant with you”?
7. Consider Dietrich Bonhoeffer: “Cheap grace is the deadly enemy of our Church. We are fighting today for costly grace. Cheap grace means grace sold on the market like cheap goods. ... Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, Communion without confession. ... Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate.”

Who Is This King of Glory? - Matthew 21:1-14 (ESV)

Now when they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, ² saying to them, "Go into the village in front of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them to me. ³ If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once." ⁴ This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying,

⁵ "Say to the daughter of Zion,

"Behold, your king is coming to you,

humble, and mounted on a donkey,

and on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden."

⁶ The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them. ⁷ They brought the donkey and the colt and put on them their cloaks, and he sat on them. ⁸ Most of the crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. ⁹ And the crowds that went before him and that followed him were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" ¹⁰ And when he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up, saying, "Who is this?" ¹¹ And the crowds said, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth of Galilee." ¹² And Jesus entered the temple and drove out all who sold and bought in the temple, and he overturned the tables of the money-changers and the seats of those who sold pigeons. ¹³ He said to them, "It is written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer,' but you make it a den of robbers." ¹⁴ And the blind and the lame came to him in the temple, and he healed them.
