God Calls Us

The Lord summons his people to worship and we respond in obedience. The Lord's call is a call to action. We gather, praise, adore, give thanks, etc. The Call to Worship is a joyful summons and a clear reminder that worship is our coming into God's presence by his command, and not our command that he come into our presence.

God Cleanses Us

The biblical response to God's call to be in his presence is confessing our sins. We humble ourselves when we approach our God. This is a corporate prayer of all God's people. It is a great privilege of the gospel that we can stand forgiven before the Lord of glory.

COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Psalm 32: 3-5

When I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long. For day and night your hand was heavy on me; my strength was sapped as in the heat of summer. Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord."

All: Almighty God, we have sinned against you and we have offended you. And yet, O Lord, as we acknowledge our sins and offenses, so also do we acknowledge you to be a merciful God, a loving Father to all who turn to you. And so we humbly ask of you, for the sake of Christ your Son, to show mercy to us, and forgive us all our offenses. By your Spirit, O God, take possession of our hearts, so that not only the actions of our lives, but also the words of our mouths, and the smallest thoughts of our minds, may be guided and governed by you. Through Jesus Christ, our Lord, be all glory and honor, now and forever. Amen. (Adapted from John Knox's liturgy of 1560)

- The Heidelberg Catechism (1563), Question 1

Leader: He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood, and has set me free from the tyranny of the devil. He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven: in fact, all things must work together for my salvation.

All: Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.

Sermon Questions For Further Reflection

- 1. To say that the Bible is God-centered seems to be so over obvious until we look at how we often live our lives. In what way can the reality of what we confess and how we live come together? What would that look like for you?
- 2. Consider: "Have you come to realize how the God-centeredness of God is good news for you? For one thing, it means that your unworthiness is irrelevant to God's readiness to save you. He is not responding to what you deserve; He is proving what a good Savior he is." —Ray Ortlund, Commentary on Isaiah
- 3. Why is it that the Lord can tell us he is our highest and greatest good and that not be narcissistic? Why is this true only of our Triune God?
- 4. Consider: "Stop praying, "Lord, I want you to make my life better." Stop praying, "Lord, I want you to make my husband or wife better. I want my children to behave. I want an ideal job." When you pray that way, you can only end up frustrated, because God will not subordinate himself to any human agenda. Start praying, "Lord, I just want you to be God to me. I want my life, with my problems, to show the world that you save sinners."" —Ray Ortlund
- 5. As Christians, we can confess that the Lord is to be the center of our lives, but why is this so hard to live out? Why does 'how' we worship matter in getting this right?
- 6. In what way does the gospel enable you to join with the psalmist and declare: "God is great!"

God Consecrates Us

Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith, and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.
