A healthy desire to change the world for the better has been done with mixed results.

- 1. Implicit social theory that guides many is deeply flawed.
- 2. World changing implies power and a model that leads to political domination
 - 1. Power is seen as "political power"
 - 2. The desire for power fueled by resentment
- 1. Defense against—the problem is secularization
- 2. Relevance to—the problem is exploitation
- 3. Purity from—the problem is violence of power

How should Christians engage the world?

- 1. We need more than good intentions
- 2. Likely no single method
- 3. Faithful presence

Jeremiah 29:4-7
