The Apostle's Creed

Sermon Questions

- 1. In our culture, what you feel most strongly is who you are. "My desires are my truest self." Why is this a wrong way to view ourselves?
- 2. Consider Charles Spurgeon: "Holy desire must lead to resolute action ...We shall find our desires to be like clouds without rain, unless followed up by practical endeavors." How can you bring actions to your desires to help change?
- 3. Jonathan Edward reminds us: "God is [our] highest good ...the enjoyment of God is the only happiness with which our souls can be satisfied ... Fathers and mothers, husbands, wives, or children, or the company of earthly friends, are but shadows; but God is the substance. These are but scattered beams, but God is the sun." In what way does this help us direct our desires rightly?
- 4. Our desires can be cultivated in good ways or bad ways. We can learn to desire the wrongs things from poor upbringings or prolonged bad situations. Style and taste in music, literature, and even relationships can all be cultivated to grow and expand or to stay small and static. Where do you see the challenge of the cultivation of godly desires in your life right now?
- 5. How does the love of Jesus in your heart help to crowd out competing affections?

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance on below)
