




Offering

- There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit.
- And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD.
- And his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD. He shall not judge by what his eyes see,

or decide disputes by what his ears hear,

- but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips she shall kill the wicked.
- Righteousness shall be the belt of his waist, and faithfulness the belt of his loins.


Sermon


God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Sermon Questions


- 1. Given their historical context, what is encouraging to Israel about a root of Jesse rising up?

- 4. How does Jesus bring these promises to fruition? What still remains (cf. 11:6-16)?
- 5. This picture of the Messiah is a kingly one. What about the rule and reign of Jesus in your life is encouraging? How is it a struggle?
