A Reminder of Life - Romans 1 & 8 (ESV)

Romans 1:18-29

¹⁸ For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth. ¹⁹ For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them ... ²¹ For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened ...

²⁴ Therefore God gave them up in the lusts of their hearts to impurity, to the dishonoring of their bodies among themselves,

²⁶ For this reason God gave them up to dishonorable passions.

²⁸ And since they did not see fit to acknowledge God, God gave them up to a debased mind to do what ought not to be done. ²⁹ They were filled with all manner of unrighteousness, evil, covetousness, malice. They are full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, maliciousness.

Sermon Questions

1. Consider: “To say “my conscience knows” something is simply to say that “I” know it, in the depths of my being, in my heart. Ethical knowledge is a function of the whole person.”—John Frame. The Bible treats us a whole persons. What does this means for us when we deal with thorny ethical issues?
2. Consider: The Didache (1st-2nd cent Christian writing) “you shall not murder a child by abortion nor kill them when born.” The Letter of Barnabas (1st cent-2nd cent Christian letter): “you shall not murder a child by abortion, nor again shall you kill it when it is born’. Tertullian’s Apology (a.d 197): “For us murder is once for all forbidden; so even the child in the womb, while yet the mother’s blood is still being drawn on to form the human being, it is not lawful for us to destroy. To forbid birth is only quicker murder. It makes no difference whether one take away the life once born or destroy it as it comes to birth. He is a man who is to be a man; the fruit is always present in the seed.” (Apology, 9:8.)
3. Willful blindness is choosing to not know what we know. How does Paul diagnosis this with fallen humanity? How do we begin to see what we don’t want to see?
4. Beside being “against abortion”, what does being “for life” look like in our lives?
5. How does Roman 8:1 minister to those who are weighed down by condemnation of their sin?

**God
Consecrates Us**
Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith, and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

**God Communes
with Us**

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's people.

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.


