COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Isaiah 29:13-14

And the Lord said: "Because this people draw near with their mouth and honor me with their lips, while their hearts are far from me, and their fear of me is a commandment taught by men, therefore, behold, I will again do wonderful things with this people, with wonder upon wonder; and the wisdom of their wise men shall perish, and the discernment of their discerning men shall be hidden."

All:

Sermon Questions

- 1. How do I normally respond when I feel overwhelmed or spiritually attacked?
- 2. What does it mean to "take refuge" in God? What do I actually do (or how do I think) differently when I am taking refuge in God?
- 3. What is different about God's "Light and Truth" helping me (in Psalm 43) versus using "remembrance/memories" (as in Psalm 42) to help me through difficult times?

Children's Question

Why is the Bible often referred to as "Light"? Why is it so important to know that the Bible is Truth? If God's Word is Light and Truth, how can that help you when you are sad or confused?
