Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Sermon Questions

1. Remember that any conversation on suicide is highly personal, it is not simply an academic question. Compassion and sensitivity should always be present.
2. “Helpless, hopeless, and worthless are three words frequently used to describe the feelings of those who are suicidal.” How do we bring power, hope, and value to others through the gospel?
3. Suicide is a sin, but is it an unforgivable sin? How does the good news of Jesus Christ help answer this question?
4. What does it mean to “renounce the blasphemy of total darkness”? How do we use the truth of Scripture to overcome our immediate emotions? Recognize this is not simply about modifying behavior or a quick fix.
5. The Bible presents our emotions in full array, but many Christians avoid this. How do we train ourselves to lament and grieve together?

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
