God Calls Us

The Lord summons his people to worship and we respond in obedience. The Lord's call is a call to action. We gather, praise, adore, give thanks, etc. The Call to Worship is a joyful summons and a clear reminder that worship is our coming into God's presence by his command, and not our command that He come into our presence.

God Cleanses Us

The biblical response to God's call to be in his presence is confessing our sins. We humble ourselves when we approach our God. This is a corporate prayer of all God's people. It is a great privilege of the gospel that we can stand forgiven before the Lord of glory.

COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: James 2:10

For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it.

Leader: You shall have no other gods before me.

All: But I often place other things on the throne of my heart above you.

Leader: You shall not make for yourself a carved image...You shall not bow down to them or serve them.

All: But I make you into who I want you to be.

Sermon Series: 1 Corinthians — Living in the Mess Pastor John Sackett Stay ... Unless ... Because — 1 Corinthians 7:17-24 (ESV)

¹⁷ Only let each person lead the life that the Lord has assigned to him, and to which God has called him. This is my rule in all the churches. ¹⁸ Was anyone at the time of his call already circumcised? Let him not seek to remove the marks of circumcision. Was anyone at the time of his call uncircumcised? Let him not seek circumcision. ¹⁹ For neither circumcision counts for anything nor uncircumcision, but keeping the commandments of God. ²⁰ Each one should remain in the condition in which he was called. ²¹ Were you a bondservant when called? Do not be concerned about it. (But if you can gain your freedom, avail yourself of the opportunity.) ²² For he who was called in the Lord as a bondservant is a freedman of the Lord. Likewise he who was free when called is a bondservant of Christ. ²³ You were bought with a price; do not become bondservants of men. ²⁴ So, brothers, in whatever condition each was called, there let him remain with God.

Sermon Outline

Sermon Questions

- 1. In verse 17 Paul remarks, that "this is my rule in all the churches". How ought this to inform our theology of the church universal?
- 2. In verse 18, Paul essentially declares that "circumcision is nothing". NT scholar Schreiner remarks, "This statement is nothing short of astonishing." Why?
- 3. The overarching theme of this passage is seen in verses 17, 20 and 24. How does this also impact Paul's discussions on marital status in verses 1-16 and 25-38?
- 4. NT Scholar Thiselton wonders "Do we consider future careers or jobs in terms of what God calls us to do for him, or in terms of what we think we shall find fulfilling and satisfying? What ought to be our answer to that question?
- 5. How could resting in our changed "essential" relationship (with God), change our view of our other relationships and circumstances?
- 6. How much emotional energy do we waste on thinking "If only ..."? What's a cure for this thinking?

Children's Question

When I was young and complaining, my father would tell me the same thing his father told him, "work will win when wishing won't". How can that help me keep from complaining; and more importantly, why am I complaining if Jesus has already finished the "real work"?

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance below)

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

God Communes with Us

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's people.
