¹Miriam and Aaron spoke against Moses because of the Cushite woman whom he had married, for he had married a Cushite woman. ²And they said, "Has the Lord indeed spoken only through Moses? Questions for Further Reflection:

- 1. What is indicated by the placement of Miriam before Aaron and the first verb in Hebrew being a feminine, singular? How might this relate to the punishment given?
- 2. Moses prays for his sister who had hurt him. Job is asked to pray for his friends who hurt him as well. Consider, "Praying for someone who has wounded you displays a freedom from vengefulness which is perhaps the irreducible and uncounterfeitable sign of participation in the covenant."—J.G. Danzen. How have you seen this demonstrated before?
- 3. What did Moses' marriage have to do with the complaint of his siblings? Does this seem to be mostly a pretext to envy or was it a serious issue in its own right?
- 4. How are we to understand verse 3 with Moses presented as a humble man given his authorship? How have you struggled in responding to false accusations?
- 5. In what way does Moses anticipate Christ in his response?

Children's Question

When you are envious of someone else, ask Jesus to change your heart so you can rejoice and be glad for that person. Jesus prayed even for his enemies and died on the cross for those who hurt him. He sets us free from our grubby hearts.
