LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

The word "Advent" comes from the Latin meaning "coming" or "arrival." Advent is a time of preparation for the final coming of Jesus, while we give thanks for the gift of Christ in the past. We meditate on the faithfulness of God to his promises – past, present, and future.

*CALL TO WORSHIP: Isaiah 52:7-10

Leader: How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings good news, who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness, who publishes salvation, who says to Zion, "Your God reigns."

All: The voice of your watchmen- they lift up their voice; together they sing for joy; for eye to eye they see the return of the LORD to Zion.

Sermon Series: Advent 2023—Anticipating Hope Pastor Lloyd Pierson, PhD. A Purified People: Zephaniah 3:9-13

Zephaniah 3 (ESV)

⁸"Therefore wait for me," declares the LORD, "for the day when I rise up to seize the prey. For my decision is to gather nations, to assemble kingdoms, to pour out upon them my indignation, all my burning anger; for in the fire of my jealousy all the earth shall be consumed. ⁹For at that time I will change the speech of the peoples to a pure speech, that all of them may call upon the name of the LORD and serve him with one accord. ¹⁰From beyond the rivers of Cush my worshipers, the daughter of my dispersed ones, shall bring my offering. ¹¹On that day you shall not be put to shame because of the deeds by which you have rebelled against me; for then I will remove from your midst your proudly exultant ones, and you shall no longer be haughty in my holy mountain. ¹²But I will leave in your midst a people humble and lowly. They shall seek refuge in the name of the LORD, ¹³those who are left in Israel; they shall do no injustice and speak no lies, nor shall there be found in their mouth a deceitful tongue. For they shall graze and lie down, and none shall make them afraid."

God **Consecrates Us** Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith. and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

Questions for Further Reflection:

- 1. In the prophets, the long portions of judgment can seem overwhelming. And yet the twin themes of judgment and hope are repeatedly connected. What happens to the biblical message of the gospel when we remove the theme of judgment?
- 2. What does this emphasis on pure speech indicate? How might this relate to Isaiah 6:5-7 and Acts 2:1-3?
- 3. The Lord must remove the cause of their wrongdoing. The people could not shake free of the vice grip of their sin. What does the Lord do to fulfill this? Is this purifying work complete in this life?
- 4. The day of the Lord includes his great judgment but we also see in 3:9, 11 that it includes his mercy on his people. How do verses 11-13 anticipate the beatitudes?

Children's Question

Have you ever been frustrated that you don't do the things you know are right and you do the things you know you should not?

How does Paul answer this problem in Romans 7:24-25?

God Communes with Us

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's people.

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
