COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: James 2:10

For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it.

Sermon Series: Romans Pastor John Sackett A Gospel for Everyone: Romans 1:1-12, 16-17

¹Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, ²which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy Scriptures, ³concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh ⁴ and was declared to be the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, 5 through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith for the sake of his name among all the nations, 6 including you who are called to belong to Jesus Christ, ⁷To all those in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. ⁸First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed in all the world. ⁹For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of his Son, that without ceasing I mention you ¹⁰ always in my prayers, asking that somehow by God's will I may now at last succeed in coming to you. ¹¹For I long to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to strengthen you—12that is, that we may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith, both yours and mine.

...¹⁶For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. ¹⁷For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."

Because Jesus is King, our response to the power of the gospel for salvation includes a surrender to His gracious rule; and this is good news worth proclaiming.

Questions for Further Reflection:

- 1. How did God use Paul's background to uniquely qualify him for his ministry?
- 2. What are some of the reasons Paul may have written Romans?
- 3. As Paul gives his initial greeting in verses 1-7, he spends more time introducing Christ. What does Paul want his audience to know about Jesus?
- 4. Verses 8-15 are full of "verbs expressing emotion and desire." What are examples of that? What drives his passion, or what is he passionate about? How does that compare with your passions?
- 5. Christopher Ash writes, "Only the Gospel humbles men and women to the ground, so that human pride ceases to make divisions and the church ceases to be a club but reaches out (from the ground as it were) to fellow sinners in love." Spend some time in prayer considering how you might need the gospel to work this way in your life.
- 6. Why is Paul not ashamed of the gospel? Is this true of you?
- 7. How does the Habakkuk 2:4 quote 'the righteous shall live by faith' help explain verse 17?

Children's Question

Why is sharing good news with your friends usually so easy and enjoyable? As we think about that, how can that help us in sharing the good news of Jesus as a saving King?
