Sermon Series—Romans: Coming Under Grace Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Impartial Judgment: Romans 2:1-11

¹Therefore you have no excuse, O man, every one of you who judges. For in passing judgment on another you condemn yourself, because you, the judge, practice the very same things. ²We know that the judgment of God rightly falls on those who practice such things. ³Do you suppose, O man—you who judge those who practice such things and yet do them yourself—that you will escape the judgment of God? 4Or do you presume on the riches of his kindness and forbearance and patience, not knowing that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance? ⁵But because of your hard and impenitent heart you are storing up wrath for yourself on the day of wrath when God's righteous judgment will be revealed. ⁶He will render to each one according to his works: ⁷to those who by patience in well-doing seek for glory and honor and immortality, he will give eternal life; 8but for those who are self-seeking and do not obey the truth, but obey unrighteousness, there will be wrath and fury. ⁹There will be tribulation and distress for every human being who does evil, the Jew first and also the Greek, ¹⁰but glory and honor and peace for everyone who does good, the Jew first and also the Greek. ¹¹For God shows no partiality.

Questions for Further Reflection:

- 1. What does Paul mean by saying God's kindness leads us to repentance?
- 2. Consider: "Paul is not preaching 'do this and you will live.' He is preaching about having a saving relationship with God that comes through faith." —Douglas Moo. How does this help us understand that Paul is not talking about works righteousness?
- 3. How does God's judgment free us from cycles of violence and reprisals?
- 4. What are the two ways to understand Paul in verses 6-11 on obedience? Is it hypothetical or is it real?
- 5. How might you respond to the statement: "A loving God would never condemn anyone to hell."? Where do people get their view of a loving God from?

Children's Question

It is easy to think we are better than someone else because we think their wrongdoing is worse than our own. Paul tells us that all wrongdoing breaks God's commands. Everyone needs to be saved by grace and not by their works.

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.
